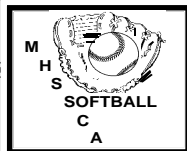

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MHSAA Baseball/ Softball Committee

In January 2005, the MHSAA Baseball /Softball Committee met in Lansing to discuss issues dealing with the sports. There were no major decisions made but some future rules discussed.

There was a short discussion of the district and regional assignments that were completed by a committee of administrators that met in December to assign the sites.

There was a review of the ever changing face mask rule. This rule will go into effect 2006. All coaches should be aware that the mask need to have the stamp of approval to be legal next year. So if you are buying them this year make sure they have the stamp.

A lengthy discussion about a correspondence regarding the a limit of inning a softball pitcher can pitch. The few expressed were that if you limit the pitcher the state final would be more representative of a team rather than a dominate pitcher. I expressed the results of the 2003 survey and indicated that we would resurvey the membership in 2006.

Hall of Fame Nominations

The Hall of Fame committee is continuing under Jim Benoit. Committee members are chosen and kept secret. Even members of the committee do not know who else is on the committee. The committee will be sent the nominations and will each send back their picks. Those picks will be compiled and sent to the executive board for approval.

Enclosed you will find an application for the Hall of Fame. Only members of the association can nominate coaches. Please take time to think about nominating people that you feel deserve that high honor. Remember the coach need not have won a state championship or even be a varsity coach. The committee is looking for people that help high school softball in the state of Michigan. The committee is looking for people who have been involved in the association and have made major contributions to softball. It is important to remember that the committee is a secret group that goes over nominations each year. A person may be on the list for several years before they are chosen. Wins and years of coaching are taken into account along with character and committee work. District and Regional Reps are important but they are only a small job in the total picture. So when you are nominating someone ask how many committees they have served on Your nomination must be sent to Jim Benoit by July, and if you have any questions ,contact Jim.

Coaches Dress for Victory

Those that are old enough , remember when coaches on the field needed to be in uniform, much like baseball. The state changed the rule to 3-5-3. Coaches shall be attired in school uniform or jersey, coaching shirt/shorts/slacks in school colors or khaki, black, white, or gray. The penalty is restriction to the dugout.

Last year I witness coaches in T-shirts and gym shorts and the shirts were un tucked and they didn't look very professional. They looked more like the were going to work out rather than coach a game. It is time for us a coaches to retake the coaching dress before we are forced to wear those same baseball pants.

So lets step it up another notch. Shirts with collars, walking shorts not gym shorts and have them all tucked in and neat. Lets show the kids how important it is to play hard but look classy at the same time.

Are You A Member in Good Standings ???

A member in good standing is a person who has paid all the dues and assessments. Each year there are some schools that fail to pay for athletes who participate in the All Star Game. Our All Star Game is a great event for all those who take part in the event, from the athletes to the coaches. We run this program on a shoestring budget and need to make sure that all athletes pay for their weekend. Coaches are asked to sign the All State form, which indicates that the coach will be responsible for the entry fee for the senior player to attend the weekend. Please communicate with your athletes and the All Star Game committee and get your past bills paid on time. The All Star Game does not make any money and we annually transfer money from our general fund.

So what is the punishment... Your school is sanctioned until the bills are paid! Please do not deny future athletes from your school the opportunity to participate in the All Star Game or become All State or your team being honored as an Academic Team. Contact Margo Brogan now and pay your bills to become a member in good standing.

As of the Clinic, Margo Brogan and Howard Stuart were working on the schools who have failed to pay for last summer. Letters have been sent to each coach and they are now in the process of sending another letter to the Athletic Directors and eventually Principals and Superintendents. So coaches you would save us a lot of work if you would get the funds from your boosters clubs or budget.

If your player agrees to play in the game as of **July 1**, you are responsible for the fee, no matter if they show up or not. So please take care of the overdue bills.

Ans. NO. We all coach plus to the work for the association so we need to have coaches abide by deadlines. If we don't we are accused of the "good ole boy" policy.

Ans. Have you seen players from other areas or just on your side of the state? We have to rely on integrity of the selectors and that starts at the district level. Strength of schedule, completed stat forms do make a difference.

Again we will be working on the committee basis for all State. If you have a question please contact the Division Chair that is in charge of your Division.

Important Facts:

1. If the sheet is not completely filled out it will not advance to the next level. - Names, stats etc.

1. Order of selection (Outfield, Short, Third, Second, First, Catcher, Pitcher)
2. Number of selections - Districts 1 per each position, plus 1 extra pitcher and a player at large from any position. (total of 11)
3. The **at large player can only advance** in the region if the player in front of them is selected to the region team. There is no at large position above districts.
4. Region selects 2 players from each position (outfield has 6, pitcher 4). (total of 20)
5. A reminder, strength of schedule is important, so make sure the schedules are on the back of the form .

Only varsity coaches who are members in good standing and have paid the current dues are eligible to nominate or vote. Each district chair will receive the list of coaches who are members after the May 1 deadline. If there is an emergency a Non Varsity or assistant may vote in their place, but only if they are members. If a coaches name is not on the list they must pay **\$35.00** to the District Chair who will forward the dues to the All State meeting.

SO,TOTALLY FILL OUT THE FORMS OR IT MAY BE THROWN OUT!

Miss Softball

Our association yearly choose one Miss Softball pitcher and one player. Miss Softball candidates are first selected from the District Level, then Regional, then each class at the State Level. The two candidates from each class are then evaluated by a committee of non active coaches. Please follow the form and materials carefully if you think you have one of the top players in the state.

This year we are asking each district and at the least each region to select a candidates. This will ensure that there are sufficient candidates on the table from each region. A reminder that Miss Softball is judged not on one season but for her total varsity experience. Thus career stats are looked at with detail. This takes some pre planning by a coach to gather the information prior to the meetings. It is important that if you feel your player is a Miss Softball candidate that you include an action shot or **two** Senior pictures with the All State forms. These are released to the media and for the All Star program. **ACTION SHOTS** are preferred for Miss softball nominations.

- After this date bring membership plus a \$10.00 late fee to the District meeting.

Academic All State

As noted at the top of the Academic All state forms for individuals and team, the G.P.A. is based on a 4.0 scale. If your school uses weighted grades (i.e. A = 5.0), has an A+ = 4.5, or uses a different scale for advanced placement classes, etc., Please! compute your athlete's G.P.A. using the following scale.

- A = 4.0
- B = 3.0
- C = 2.0
- D = 1.0

Criteria:

Not all of the high schools in the state are fortunate enough to offer advanced placement classes or weighted grades. The information received from schools in the past indicates that each institution computes its grades differently. In order to make the selection process equitable to the young ladies participating in softball in approximately six hundred schools, the Association developed these guidelines.

The cut off date is postmarked by MAY 1. Please do not call after the date requesting extensions. We are not the ones who want to deny your players an award. So pick your team in March and immediately send in the form and you won't have to explain it to administration and parents why your players are not all state academic.

Three Player Rule

I get many phone calls and e-mails dealing with the 3 man rule. The answer is short and sweet..From the beginning of school to the first day of practice in March no high school coach, volunteer etc. is allowed to work with more than 3 players grades 7-12. This means no sports specific equipment maybe used. Balls ,bats, gloves etc. Players can not be working with one coach in one room and another in another room in the building. Kids can't be sitting on the side or be in the vicinity of the player and coach. I have had calls reporting that coaches are holding clinic and charging the players so they think it doesn't count. YES it does. Having parents run the practice is also questionable because of school liability and their connection with the school program.

The baseball/softball committee is working on changing the rule but for now, **rules are rules and need to be followed.**

Cut off Date are strickly enforced.....

So do your assignments on time.....Dues, academics etc. So don't tell us we don't care about kids when it is you that forget to turn in the forms or join before the cut off date.

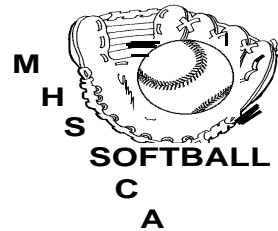

- 1. Coaches fill out the forms completely**
 - 2. Coaches dress appropriately during games**
 - 3. 3 player rule is followed by all.**

Stats and Schedules are Important

Just a reminder to all coaches. It is important that you keep good stats. Statistics are important to the all state selection. Probably one of the most important stat is the amount of games a player plays at a particular position. You can not nominate your shortstop for the outfield if she hasn't played in a majority of the inning she played in the outfield.

Also taken into account is the strength of schedule that your team plays. So it is important that your schedule is attached to the All State form.

No form will be considered unless it is **TOTALLY** filled out. Regional and District Chairs are **NOT** to consider forms not filled out Completely. At the next level the player may be removed from consideration.

District Chairmen should contact member coaches in their district by the last week in May. If you are not contacted, contact the District or Regional Chairman.

What Happens if No One wants to be District Chairman ????

Sometimes people get busy and do not apply to be the district chair . If that happens, we assign another district chairman from nearby to host both district meetings. If we still do not have a volunteer, the district without a chairman will have no vote at the regional meeting.

Our problem is that we have some districts with multiple volunteers and in others we have no one who wants the job. If you are in a district that does not have a chair ,please contact the Regional chairman.

Responsibility of All State Chairs

2005 MHSSCA ALL STAR GAME

Each Class Chair has selected the Regional Chairs. The Regional Chairs have the responsibility to select the District Chairs. If you see that your district or Region has not been filled contact the person responsible for the selection.

Meetings of the District coaches are to be held prior to the Regional Tournament. The place and time are the responsibility of the District Chairs. Each District chair should attempt to hold the meeting in a place and time good for every coach. Member coaches in each district should attempt to contact the district chairs around the district, for the time and place (especially if you are not a school employee). Regional meetings are held prior to the quarterfinals.

The Regional chairs are responsible to send in the regional team in an email to their class chair at a time and date given to them.

There is a responsibility that comes along with being a chair. That is simply to be as honest as possible in each meeting. A District chair is responsible to express the views of all the coaches in their district. Region chairs need to carry on the information to the all state table. If a coach finds there is an emergency and can not attend the meetings it is their responsibility to find a replacement. If a regional chair does not attend the meeting all the players in that region will not be voted on for all state.

The process starts with all varsity coaches to make sure they have paid their dues, fill out the forms totally, and are in members in good standing from past dues. Then attend the meetings and vote.

DUE DATES ARE IMPORTANT

Enclosed you will find a calendar of this year's activities. It is extremely important that you pay attention to the due dates. All due date are postmark dates. Since most of us that run the various committees also coach, it is important that we are not plagued with late materials. Please do not procrastinate about turning in information; you will only be hurting your own players.

Some advice

1. Turn you application in **TODAY**.
2. Check with business offices or Athletic Directors and make sure they have turned in your check and application.

Before May 1

3. Fill out forms for the Hall of Fame .
4. In **MARCH** check with Seniors that made your team and who may qualify for the scholarship award. Get them working on the information that is needed. Scholarship forms due April 15
5. **AS SOON AS YOU SELECT YOUR TEAM** calculate the teams GPA and send it in March.

If you do the forms early before the season starts you will not be on of those that get caught up in the season and miss the dates and deprive your team of their accolades.

The success of the all star game lies with each varsity coach. Please go to your senior athletes NOW and talk to them about the weekend of July 22-23, 2005. Ask them to keep that date open and to talk to their summer coaches so they are aware that if they are chosen they will be playing in the all star game. We had a lot of difficulty last year especially in D1 when we had to go down to district teams to fill the team. If we truly want to have an all star team we need the all stars and all state team members. Options discussed were only having two games which would limit some great athletes. Also in the discussion for the future is having the game on a weekday and not have the girls stay over night. This would eliminate conflicts with summer teams but also the bonding that goes on in the dorms.

New in 2005 we will be attempting to choose honorary coaches. Like the players we sometimes have to make multiple calls to find coaches. The Softball Rankings will again be done by Tom Hamilton and his committee. Coaches, who feel their teams deserve to be ranked, should contact Tom by Saturday of each week. Please indicate record and ranked teams played for ease in ranking. The weekly rankings will be on our web site by Monday of each week. Official ranking will not happen until April. Because it is difficult to know teams from four different division and covering all of Michigan it is up to each coach to be involved. The committee takes into account comments from coaches as well as strength of schedules.

Pre season rankings are based on last year finishes. Each division got together at the softball clinic in Lansing.

MHSSCA Academic All State Team / Senior Individual Application

The Academic all State Team requires that a varsity team have a combined 3.0 grade point average; the senior individual, 3.6. This is based on the student's cumulative grade point average at the end of the first semester of this school year. all grades are based on a **4.0 scale**. Who is eligible?

A high school senior softball player must:

1. Be a senior softball player whose head coach is a current MHSSCA member
2. Be a citizen of the United States of America, and resident within the jurisdiction of the state of Michigan
3. Have outstanding personal character and behavior patterns as a leader in their school and community.
4. Be a student of outstanding merit, who shows an appreciation of the value of education.
5. Rank in the upper one quarter of the class and have test scores (ACT and/or SAT) to indicate academic success.
6. Have on record a letter of acceptance from an accredited college or university of the individual's choice.

A child of a coach must:

1. Be a high school senior or high school graduate whose parent is a current or former high school coach and current MHSSCA member in good standing.
2. Be a citizen of the United States of America, and resident within the jurisdiction of the state of Michigan
3. Have outstanding personal character and behavior patterns as a leader in their school and community.
4. Be a student of outstanding merit, who shows an appreciation of the value of education.
5. If a high school senior, rank in the upper one quarter of the high school class and have test scores (ACT and/or SAT) to indicate academic success
6. If a college student, have at least a 3.0 GPA for college courses.
7. Have proof of acceptance or attendance from an accredited college or university of the individual's choice

What are the policies of the scholarship program?

1. A recipient must be a full time student
2. Scholarships are for one year only and are not renewable.
3. Scholarship are given in the form of certificates of award conditioned upon enrollment of the student in courses at accredited two or four year college or university
4. Upon proof of enrollment from the applicant, a MHSSCA check will be sent to the recipient. Payment will be made in two equal installments for students in semester schools and three equal installments for students in tri-mester schools.
5. Our scholarship offer will be withdrawn from any student accepted into a military academy who is to receive tuition and salary.
6. The scholarship award shall be forfeited immediately upon knowledge of failure to continue with classes because of misconduct, scholastic deficiency or other disqualifying causes
